Head Lice

We have had a reported case of head lice at school. Please check your child's hair regularly and treat when necessary.

An effective way of checking for lice is using a head lice comb. Comb conditioner through the hair to check for lice and recomb after treating with a Head Lice treatment.

Spray a diluted mix of tea tree or eucalyptus oil on hair each morning. This keeps head lice under control. (Please a Headlice factsheet attached).

Rules for Responsible Information Communication Technology Use

The rules for responsible Information Communication Technology (ICT) use, which are as follows, are intended to minimise the likelihood of harm by educating students and setting standards which will serve to protect the school and its students. We would encourage you to use this as an opportunity to have a discussion with your child about your family values and your expectations about how these values should guide your child's activities while he/she is using ICT.

In ticking each rule and signing the contract below you are accepting the rules for responsible Information Communication Technology use.

Using computers, mobile devices, the Internet, email and communication tools:

□ I will only access the computer network system with the login and password I have been given, which I will keep private.

□ I will not access, view, examine, alter, amend, delete, copy or transmit documents, files or data created by another student without their consent.

 \Box I will use USB sticks for school work only, not music, games or other inappropriate files.

□ I will gain permission before printing or inserting a USB/CD.

□ I will not display, transmit, redistribute or forward confidential information about oneself or another such as, but not limited to, home addresses, phone numbers, email addresses and birthdates without proper authorisation.

□ I will not modify or change computer settings and/or internal or external configurations without permission.

□ I will not harm, disrupt, degrade or destroy DEC or school equipment, data, networks, system performance.

□ I will not use personally owned information communication technology, such as but not limited to, smartphones, smartwatches and tablets, to film, take photographs, connect to the internet and access applications.

 $\hfill\square$ I will ask permission from a teacher before using the internet.

- □ I will report any unpleasant material to my teacher immediately because this will help protect other pupils and myself.
- \Box I understand that the school may check my computer files and may monitor the internet sites I visit.
- \Box I will not sign up or subscribe to anything without permission from my teacher.

□ I will respect copyright and will not use Fingal Head Public School's technology resources to copy, download, store or transmit any material authored or owned by another individual.

- $\hfill \Box$ I will ask permission from a teacher before checking e-mail.
- $\hfill\square$ I will only email and read emails from people my teacher has approved.
- □ I will immediately report any unpleasant messages sent to me because this would help protect other pupils and myself.
- $\hfill\square$ I understand that e-mail messages I receive or send may be read by others.

□ I will only use teacher-permitted blogs, wikis, discussion forums and other communication tools for instructional, school-related activities.

- □ I will not access personal, non-DEC email accounts.
- □ I will not use disrespectful language in emails, blogs, wikis, or other communication tools.

I understand that although staff will supervise my child's use of the iPad/mobile device and the Internet, it is my child's responsibility to not access inappropriate material.

HEADLICE

WHAT ARE HEAD LICE?

- Head lice are tiny insects that live in hair, where they breed and feed on blood from the scalp. They are about the size of a sesame seed, have six legs, and range from tan to greyish-white in colour. They live up to 30 days and cannot survive for more than two days away from the human scalp.
- Nits are the eggs of the head lice. They look like small whitish specks about the size of a pinhead and are glued to the hair shaft. Nits are first laid very close to the scalp, and then grow out with the hair. Nits hatch within seven to 10 days and mature into adult lice in about seven days.
- **Head lice** crawl; they cannot fly or jump and they do not live on animals. They hang on to the hair with hook-like claws at the end of each leg.
- Nits are usually found on the hair shaft at the nape of the neck, under the fringe and behind the ears.

HOW ARE THEY SPREAD?

• Lice are spread by head-to-head contact, or sometimes from sharing hats, headgear, combs or brushes with an infested person.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

Symptoms may be absent, or may include:

- A tickling feeling in the hair
- Itchy scalp from lice bites
- Sores can develop from scratching and these can sometimes become infected
- Fine black powder (lice faeces) or pale grey lice skins may be seen on the pillow.

TO CHECK FOR HEAD LICE AND NITS:

- Look closely through the hair and scalp for nits and lice with a bright light, magnifying glass and fine-tooth comb.
- Nits are usually noticed first and are easier to see. They are glued to the hair shaft, behind the ears and at the back of the neck. Unlike dandruff they cannot be brushed off.

IF YOU FIND HEAD LICE:

Check the rest of the household for head lice, and **only treat if they are detected**.

- Treat everyone found to be infested on the same day.
- Treat again in seven days.
- Tell any possible close contacts, such as friends and work mates.
- After the first treatment, the affected person can return to school or work.

HOW DOYOU TREAT HEAD LICE?

- For a baby under 12 months of age, or if you are pregnant, or breast feeding, or have sensitive skin, consult a health professional for advice. Manual removal may be recommended in preference to chemical disinfection.
- Head lice treatments can be purchased from a chemist without a prescription. Follow the instructions.
- Avoid getting the product into eyes; cover eyes with a towel or washer and wear gloves when applying the product. Wash your hands thoroughly after use.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Do not use a conditioner on hair before (or after) applying the treatment.
- Do not blow dry hair after treatment as the heat may inactivate the product.
- Do not re-wash hair for one to two days after treatment.

AFTER TREATMENT

- Check that the product worked. Comb hair with a finetooth comb, wipe contents onto a tissue or cloth, and look for any movement. If lice are still active, the head lice could be resistant to the insecticide. Wash hair and treat again using a product with a different insecticide base (ask your pharmacist).
- If the other preparation fails, daily inspection and removal of eggs and lice with a fine-tooth comb or fingernails is the only option left. This procedure is tedious but, if followed strictly, will eventually clear the hair of lice. A magnifying glass may help you to see the eggs and lice more easily.
- Check combs, brushes, headgear and bedding for lice. Combs and brushes may be soaked in hot water (>50°C) and detergent for 10 minutes. Bed linen, clothes, and towels can be washed in the hot cycle in the washing machine or in a hot drier. Items that cannot be washed or dry-cleaned (for example, hats) can be placed in a plastic bag for a minimum of four days.
- Nit removal is not necessary.
- To help minimise levels of head lice within the community, it is a good idea to check your child's hair on a weekly basis.
